I want to offer word of thanks for the emails, texts, cards, videos and good wishes sent in recognition of our twenty years of ministry at NCC and the 35th anniversary of my ordination. Those who watched “On the Preacher’s Porch” on June 21st heard me say this is a shared accomplishment that belongs not only to the pastor but also to the pastor’s family and to the parish. I am beyond blessed to have Beth and our family as partners in the journey of life and ministry. A long tenure in ministry is also a testimony to a congregation’s good nature and forbearance. While I am not one to spend much time hearkening back to the past, an occasion like this invites us to pause, to take stock and to be grateful for ways the Holy Spirit has been present. Much has happened in twenty years, and more is happening all the time! We trust the Holy Spirit will energize us for even greater witness in Christ’s name. Thank you dear church and thank you to the gifted staff and servant volunteers for your gracious and faithful discipleship.

With the help of technology, NCC continues to connect, worship, fellowship and learn. On March 25th church life moved online, at least mostly. Steve Ash, Lea Jones, Eileen Baumgarten, Phyllis Scott and Ronda Bower continue to carry out their duties with enthusiasm, skill and faithfulness. Ronda has adult bible study three times a week and Sunday School for children once a week. There was even a June Virtual Messy Church! We were able to enjoy “Stories with Ronda” twice a week until the weather warmed up enough that children could get outside more regularly. NCC continues to have board and committee meetings via Zoom as well.

Our Men’s small group meets weekly via video conferencing. There have been fourteen Sunday worship services recorded and uploaded to the church website. Thank you Rob Orr and Bill Jesse for “making the magic happen.” Beth and I have welcomed friends from near and far “On the Preacher’s Porch” twenty-six times since the beginning of the lockdown in March, for a total of forty live or virtual engagements with friends and members. Facebook Live, Zoom and other technologies have been helpful in our endeavors to stay as connected as possible in these strange and uncertain times. These mediums have been helpful, but not altogether satisfying.

The question constantly before us continues to be when NCC will re-open in some way. The Moderators and staff have been in regular, thoughtful discussion regarding the best time, way and place to resume worship and gatherings. As I write this, Cook County is moving to Phase 4 in just a couple days. Provided it is the sensible thing to do, and there are no spikes in diagnosed cases of the virus in our area, NCC will very likely resume worship in the next few weeks even as we continue to livestream and upload the services. As our worship leaders have said each week in worship, “We are learning as we go. Please be patient.”

As others have said, the church isn’t closed; far from it. We are adapting and learning to be the church in new ways in order to bear the gospel in faithful ways.

I look forward to seeing you in person in the not-too-distant future.

Adult faith formation opportunities continue with Sunday Seminar, Sunday mornings at 11:30 on Zoom, discussion the Jim Wallis book *Christ in Crisis*. Tuesday morning Women's Bible Study is studying the Revised Common Lectionary scripture for the upcoming Sunday. Many of the women meet by Zoom on Tuesdays at 10:00 a.m., and scriptures and thoughts are emailed out to everyone even if not meeting on Zoom. Relevant Bible Study is meeting at 9:00 on Saturday mornings, studying the book of Acts. There are also a few small group studies meeting.

175/75 Anniversary Celebration –Gary Eberlein

Growing, Changing, Serving . . .

The humble 1845 one-room church building on what is now Dundee Road was abandoned when the congregation re-located to a much needed, much larger, more traditional high-steepled, white frame church in the center of Northfield Township. This new 1863 church building on Shermer Road was expanded in 1875 when transepts were added to form the shape of the cross. This provided balcony seating on both sides for the congregation, seating for a choir and new space for a pipe organ. In 1903 the original parsonage was replaced with a large brick home, modern for the time and more inviting and comfortable for pastors and their families. Then in 1912 the entire church building was raised, and a basement constructed beneath, providing much needed meeting and storage space.

Northfield Township and the communities of Glenview and Northbrook were growing steadily in the early 1920's. Businesses, schools and churches were expanding. However, Park Districts, as we know them today, had not yet been formed. Recognizing the need for recreational facilities, St. Peter Evangelical Neighborhood Church, as it was known then, constructed a "Community House" in 1925 consisting of four bowling lanes, a gymnasium, a stage and a complete kitchen. In addition, were classrooms for Sunday School, a library and an office for the pastor.

The decades of the 1930's – 1950's was growth not in terms of physical facilities, but in membership and service to the community. Men's and women's bowling leagues were formed drawing from neighboring communities along with women's and men's basketball teams. Theatrical performances were presented, orchestra and band concerts preformed, and the kitchen and gym used for serving special occasions. In the 1930's the Sunday School was reorganized into departments and grades, bus service was provided in both towns and school attendance reached 125 on Sundays with a staff of about twenty (23 named in 1955). *The church has been distinctly and seriously engaged in teaching the will of God. We put the emphasis on the teaching function because it is the secret of growth. A Christian can no more grow without the Lord than a man can grow without food.* (1930 St. Peter Church Souvenir Booklet)

It took three-and-a-half years after the 1961 fire for the congregation to rise from the ashes, so-to-speak, and dedicate a new building on Willow Road just east of Pfingsten Road. This great challenge brought the congregation together, stronger than ever with a new pastor to continue the work of the Lord, now able to serve the communities with enough space for an expanded Sunday school, a private academy, later the Northbrook Community Preschool, and a scout troop could meet and hold events. The choir now had a rehearsal room and music library and the fellowship hall provided space for bazaars, community dinners and large singing groups to rehearse (The Melodeers Women's Chorus and the New Tradition Men's Chorus). There was dedicated space for the quilters, a meeting space for the youth fellowship, a ball field for inter-church youth league softball, a community garden (21 plots available to any interested gardener) and in 2009 an outdoor labyrinth open to the public.
